

DRAFT Joint Plan of Action under the Bilateral Agreement
between
the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the Kingdom of Cambodia
on
Strengthening Cooperation in Counter Trafficking in Persons

In order to achieve the Bilateral Agreement between the Royal Government of Cambodia and the Government of the People's Republic of China on Strengthening Cooperation in Counter Trafficking in persons (SCCT), both parties agree to implement the Joint Plan of Action as follows:
