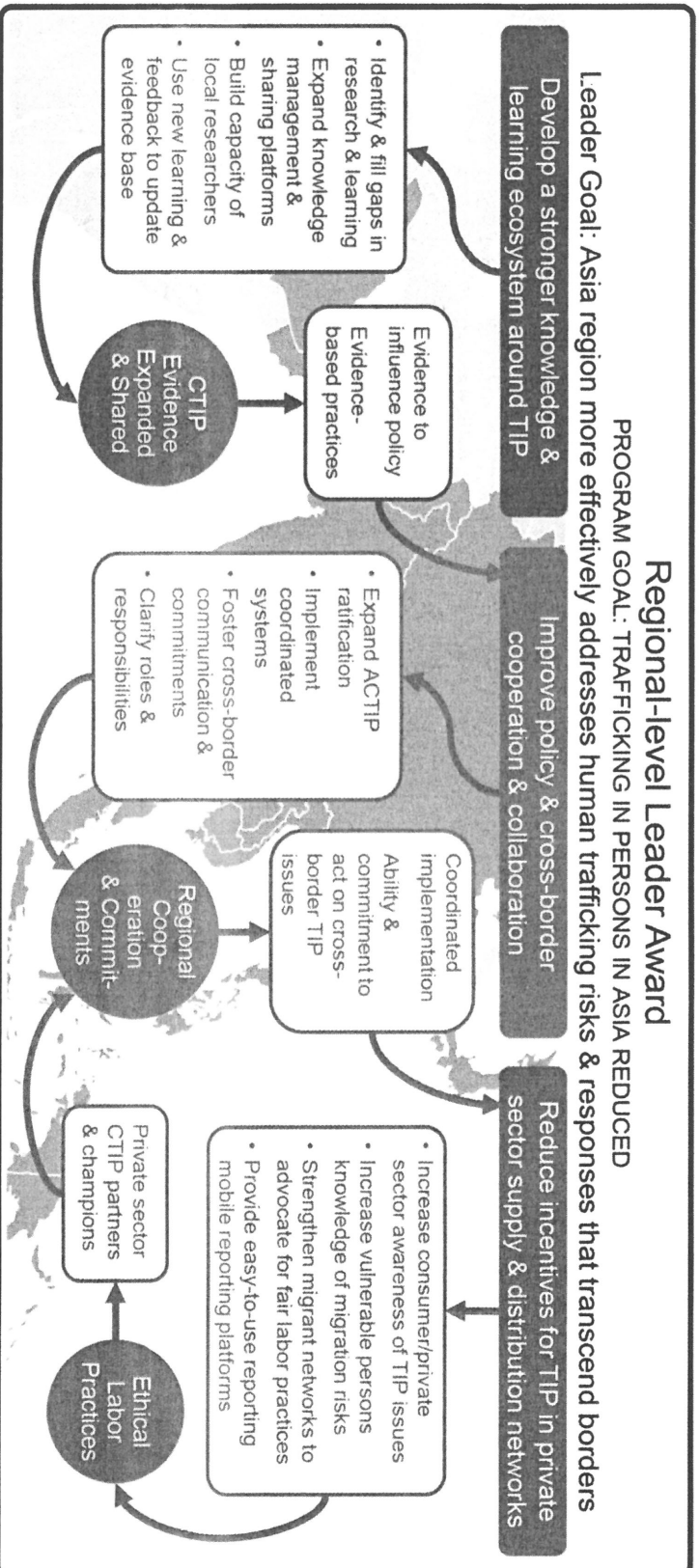

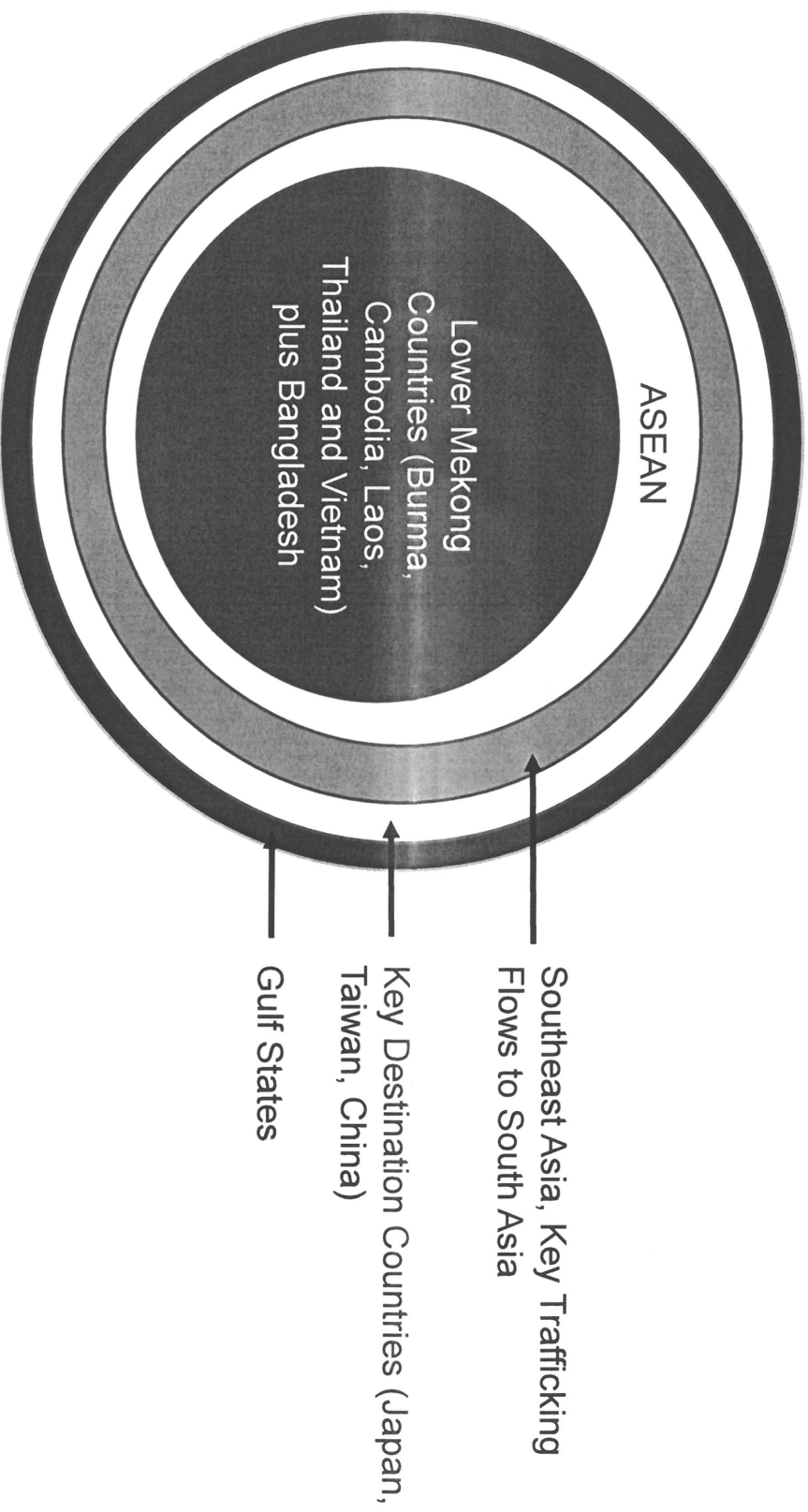
Risk of TIP among vulnerable populations reduced

Lower Mekong & other ASEAN countries

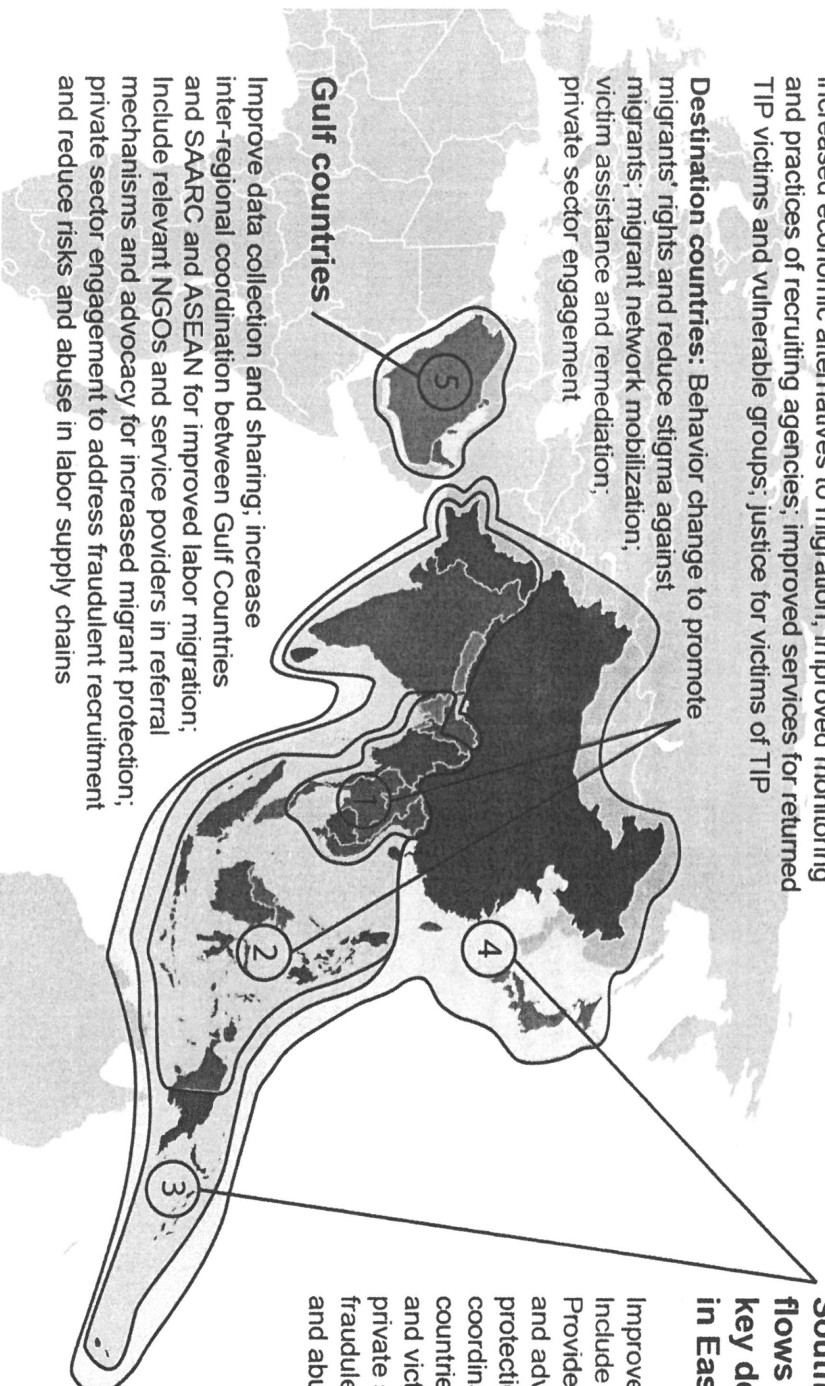
All countries: Improved data collection and sharing; standardized victim identification and referral protocols implemented; relevant NGOs engaged in regional advocacy and monitoring; Capacity building for government officials and private sector to identify and address TIP

Source countries: Improved behaviors related to safe migration; increased economic alternatives to migration; improved monitoring and practices of recruiting agencies; improved services for returned TIP victims and vulnerable groups; justice for victims of TIP

Destination countries: Behavior change to promote migrants' rights and reduce stigma against migrants; migrant network mobilization; victim assistance and remediation; private sector engagement

Gulf countries

Improve data collection and sharing; increase inter-regional coordination between Gulf Countries and SAARC and ASEAN for improved labor migration; Include relevant NGOs and service providers in referral mechanisms and advocacy for increased migrant protection; private sector engagement to address fraudulent recruitment and reduce risks and abuse in labor supply chains

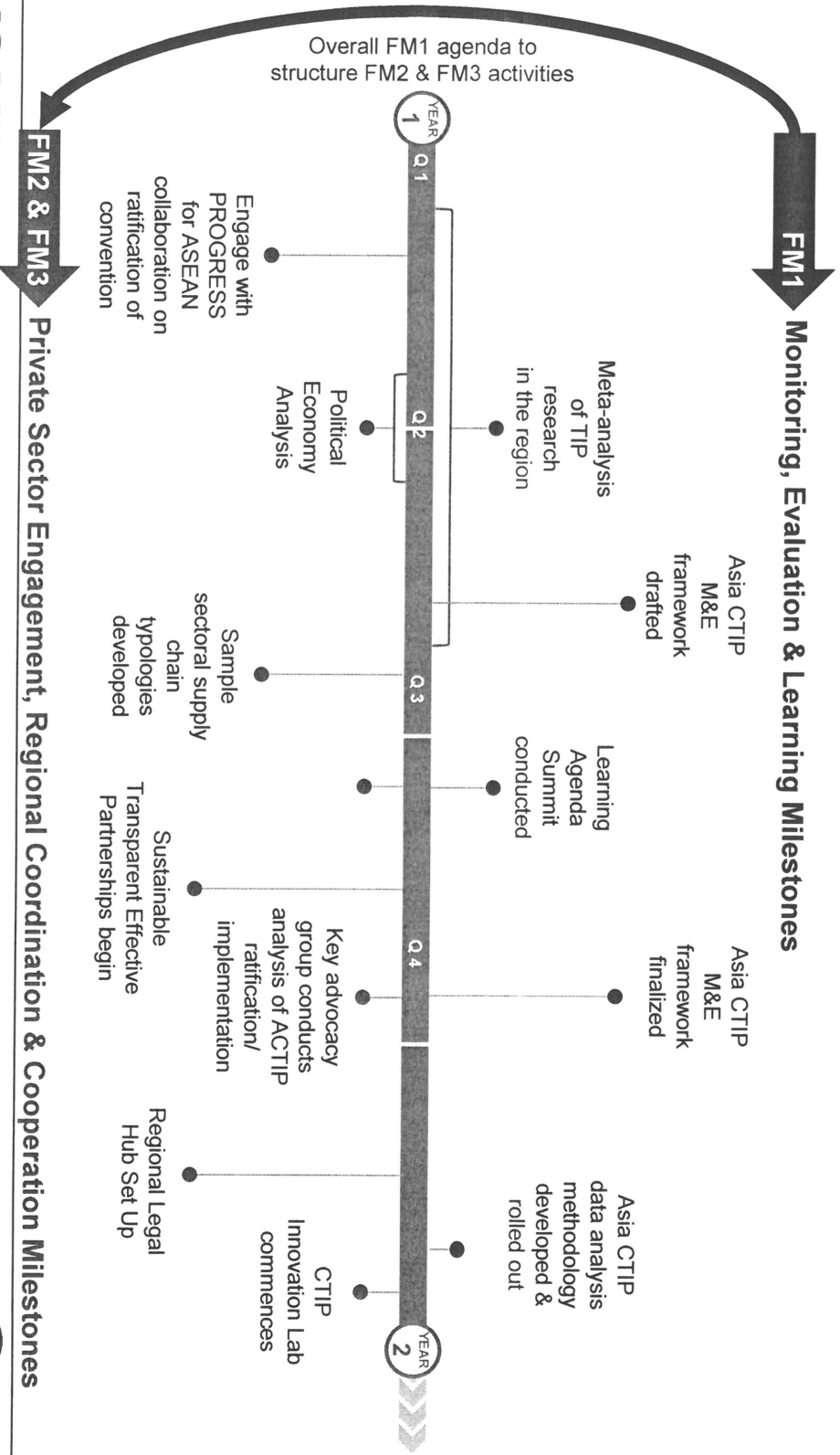

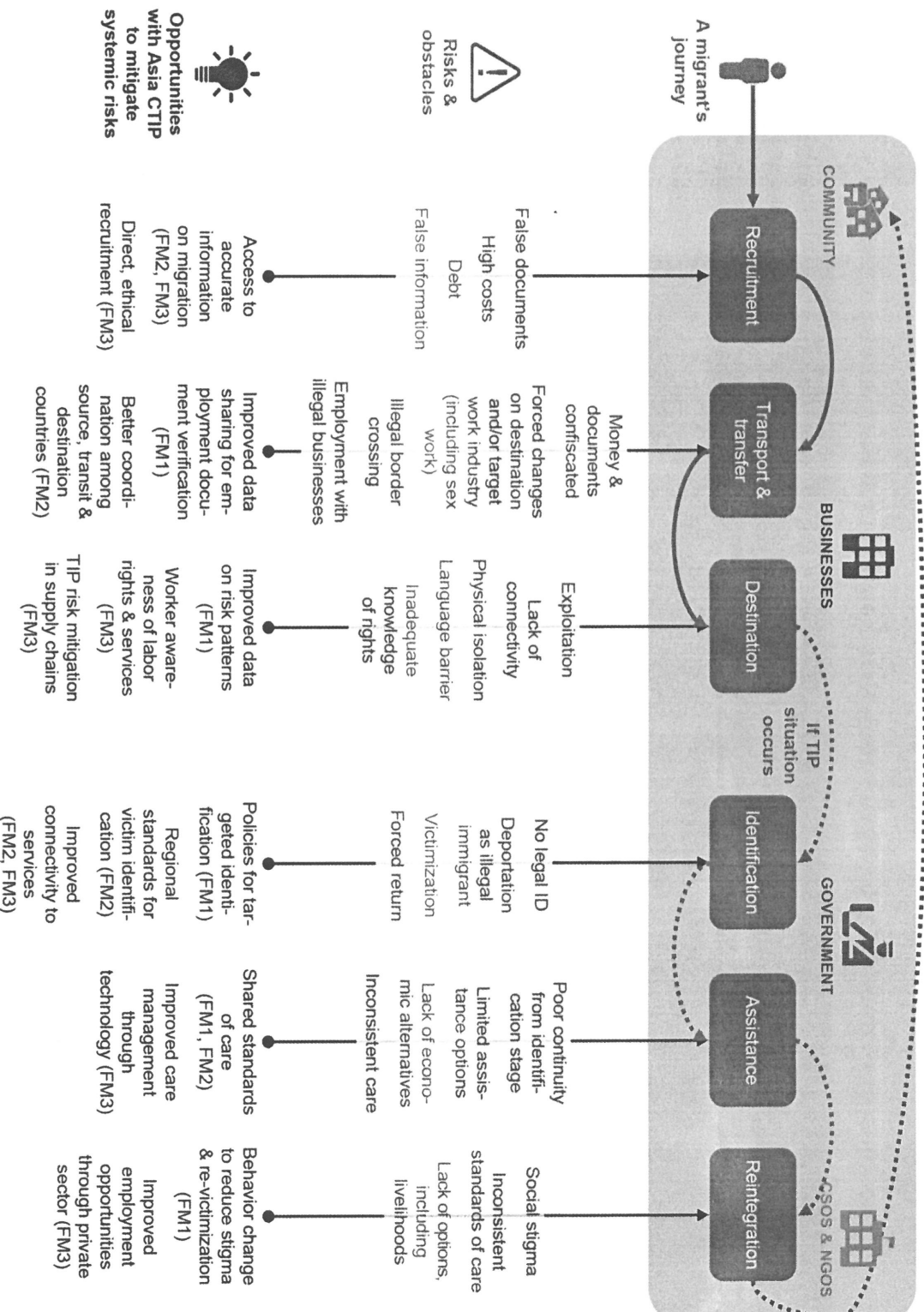
